A BILL

To promote diversity in the national apprenticeship system.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Apprenticeship Access
- 5 for All Act of 2020".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROMOTING DIVERSITY IN THE NATIONAL APPREN-
- 7 TICESHIP SYSTEM.
- 8 The Secretary of Labor shall promote diversity and
- 9 ensure equal opportunity to participate in programs for

1	apprentices, youth apprentices, and pre-apprentices, in-
2	cluding—
3	(1) taking steps necessary to promote diversity
4	in apprenticeable occupations under the national ap-
5	prenticeship system, especially in high-skill, high-
6	wage, or in-demand industry sectors and occupations
7	in areas with high percentages of low-income individ-
8	uals;
9	(2) ensuring programs under the national ap-
10	prenticeship system—
11	(A) adopt and implement policies to pro-
12	vide for equal opportunity in such programs, as
13	described in section 30.3 of title 29, Code of
14	Federal Regulations (as in effect on January
15	31, 2020);
16	(B) do not engage in intimidation or retal-
17	iation as prohibited under section 30.17 of title
18	29, Code of Federal Regulations (as in effect or
19	January 31, 2020); and
20	(C) are subject, for any violation of sub-
21	paragraphs (A) or (B), to enforcement action
22	as described in section 30.15 of title 29, Code
23	of Federal Regulations (as in effect on January
24	31, 2020); and

1	(3) supporting the recruitment, employment,
2	and retention of nontraditional apprenticeship popu-
3	lations in programs under the national apprentice-
4	ship system in high-skill, high-wage, and in-demand
5	industry sectors and occupations, including women,
6	people of color, individuals with disabilities, individ-
7	uals impacted by the criminal and juvenile justice
8	system, and individuals with barriers to employment,
9	as applicable.
