Hunger

PROTECTING FAMILIES AND FARMERS

- Secured \$850,000 for Nourish Up's Hunger Hub in West Charlotte.
- Continued the Adams Hunger Initiative policy roundtables with partners like Second Harvest Food Bank and Feeding Charlotte.
- Introduced the Closing the Meal Gap Act and Food Secure Strikers Act to expand SNAP benefits.
- Opposed \$186 billion in SNAP cuts and fought for families affected by the government shutdown.
- Authored the Fair Credit for Farmers Act to review USDA Farm Loans and National Appeals Division.

Health

EXPANDING ACCESS TO QUALITY, AFFORDABLE CARE

- Fought against deep cuts to Medicare and Medicaid in the "One Big Ugly Bill."
- Secured nearly \$1 billion for the Maternal and Child Health Block Grant and \$5 million for midwifery training programs.
- As Co-Founder and Co-Chair of the Black Maternal Health Caucus, delivered over \$200 million in new funding since 2023.
- Hosted the Women's History Month Health Webinar and Black Maternal Health events with Care Ring, Black Health Matters, and C.W. Williams Community Health Center.

Higher Education

STRENGTHENING STUDENTS AND SCHOOLS

- Helped secure more than \$12 million in federal grants for 12th District colleges and universities.
- Led efforts to release \$5.5 billion in K-12 school funding following administration delays.
- Protected HBCU programs and restored the 1890 Scholars Program.
- Re-launched the E-Learning Caucus and co-led multiple bipartisan letters defending student aid and affordability.

Housing

SAFE, DECENT, AND AFFORDABLE HOMES

- Introduced the American Neighborhoods Protection Act to address corporate ownership of single-family homes and boost down-payment assistance.

- Supported key legislation, including the Fair Housing Improvement Act and Home Energy Assistance during the shutdown.
